

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#### Introduction

The ProSpanish Topic Vocabulary Course is designed to layer range and fluency onto the key structures learned with the Levels 1-6 Course. #### Recommended sequence:

- 3. 'Read and Learn'. Read the Spanish paragraph and try to work out the meaning. There will be unfamiliar language embedded but most of it is guessable from the context. If time allows, commit as much of the paragraph and its meaning to

> \*The type of English translation provided varies, depending on the exercise. In the grids and 10 sentence translations, the focus is on grasping the main structure and meaning of the target language. Giving English equivalents that closely resemble the original language's structure helps with the assimilation process. Whereas, the English paragraph translation provides a more realistic style, so that learners are exposed to the different ways meanings can be expressed..
